CITY OF FREEPORT CHARTER REVIEW COMMISSION FINAL REPORT

To the Honorable Mayor and City Council:

The Charter Review Commission for the June to December, 2011, term, having reviewed the Home Rule Charter of the City and having consulted with the City Manager, the City Attorney and others who are to be consulted, recommends the following changes be submitted to the citizens.

First, consider amending the first sentence of Section 3.02 Qualifications to read:

"The Mayor and each member of the City Council shall be a registered voter and a resident citizen of the City of Freeport for at least twelve (12) consecutive months and, in the case of members of City Council other than the Mayor, a resident of the Ward sought to be represented for at last six (6) consecutive months, immediately preceding his or her application to have his or her name placed on the official ballot and the filing of proof of his or her qualifications as required by law."

Second, consider amending Item (m) of Section 3.07, Powers of the City Council, to read as follows:

"(m) Fix the salaries and compensation of the employees of the City and of all officers of the City other than that of the Mayor and other members of the City Council."

Note: The above rewording of Item (m) of Section 3.07 clarifies that the compensation of officers mentioned in that item is the compensation of officers like the municipal court judge, etc. who are appointed.

Third, consider repealing Items (e) and (f) of Section 4.05, Municipal Court, and adding Item (c) to Section 4.02, Department of Police, to read as follows:

"(c) The Chief of Police shall appoint one of the members of the Police Department to act a warrant officer. The warrant officer shall execute warrants and other process issued by the Judge or Clerk of the Municipal Court, attend and act as bailiff at all sessions of the Municipal Court, act as security officer for all Municipal Court personnel and perform such other and further duties as may be requested of him by the Municipal Court Judge or assigned by the Chief of Police, with priority being given by the warrant officer to discharging the duties of warrant officer as specified herein."

Fourth, consider amending the first sentence of Section 4.07, Department of Health, to read as follows:

"The City Council may appoint a City Health Officer who shall be a licensed physician qualified to practice medicine in the State of Texas and a resident of the City of Freeport."

Fifth, considering amending Item (d) of Section 8.03, Planning Commission, to read as follows:

"(1) Make recommendations for the amendment, extension and additions to the master plan for the physical development of the City;"

Sixth, amend the first sentence of Section 9.14, Contingent Appropriation, to read:

"Provisions shall be made in the annual budget and in the appropriation ordinance for an appropriation of a reserve in an amount of not more than five per centum (5%) of the total budget, not to exceed eight million dollars, to be used by the City Manager, with the consent of the City Council, in case of unforeseen contingencies."

ORDINANCE NO. 2012-2298

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF FREEPORT, TEXAS, CONTAINING A PREAMBLE; AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF SAID CITY TO ADOPT THE 2009 EDITIONS OF THE INTERNATIONAL BUILDING CODE, INTERNATIONAL RESIDENTIAL CODE, INTERNATIONAL MECHANICAL CODE, INTERNATIONAL EXISTING BUILDING CODE, INTERNATIONAL PROPERTY MAINTENANCE CODE, INTERNATIONAL PLUMBING CODE, INTERNATIONAL FUEL GAS CODE, AND INTERNATIONAL ENERGY CONSERVATION CODE AND THE 2008 EDITION OF THE INTERNATIONAL ELECTRICAL CODE, ALSO KNOWN AS THE NATIONAL ELECTRICAL CODE; ADOPTING LOCAL AMENDMENT THERETO; PROVIDING THAT ANY PERSON VIOLATING SAID CODE, AS AMENDED BY THIS ORDINANCE, SHALL BE GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR AND ASSESSED A FINE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 10.99 OF SAID CODE OF ORDINANCES; PROVIDING THAT EACH DAY ANY SUCH VIOLATION CONTINUES AND EACH PART OF ANY DAY ANY SUCH VIOLATION OCCURS SHALL CONSTITUTE A SEPARATE OFFENSE; CONTAINING BAVINGS CLAUSES; CONTAINING A SEVERANCE CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING THAT THIS ORDINANCE SHALL TAKE EFFECT AND BE IN FORCE FROM AND AFTER THIS DESCRIPTIVE CAPTION HAS BEEN PUBLISHED TWICE IN THE BRAZOSPORT FACTS.

WHEREAS, the City of Freeport, Texas ("the City"), is a "Home Rule City" and a "Home Rule Municipality" lying and situated in Brazoria County, Texas, as described in and defined by Section 5, Article XI of the Constitution of Texas and Section 1.005 of the Local Government Code of Texas, respectively; and,

WHEREAS, Chapter 214 of the Local Government Code of Texas and Sections 2.01, 2.02 and Item (u) of Section 3.07 of the Home Rule Charter of the City authorize the City Council thereof to adopt the provisions of this Ordinance; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City has determined and does here now declare that the adoption of this ordinance is necessary to the health, safety and general welfare of the inhabitants of the City.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FREEPORT, TEXAS:

First, Section 150.001 of the Code of Ordinances of the City is hereby amended to substitute "International Building Code, 2009 Edition" for "International Building Code, 2003 Edition" at all places in which the latter appears therein; and Division (A) of Section 150.003 is amended to substitute "International Code published by the International Code Council" for Standard Code published by the Southern Building Code Congress".

Second, Section 150.010 of the Code of Ordinances of the City is hereby amended to substitute "International Residential Code, 2009 Edition" for "International Residential Code, 2003 Edition" at all place in which the latter appears therein; and any section references contained in Section 150.011 of said Code of Ordinances are amended to correspond with the sections of the former.

Third, Section 150.015 of the Code of Ordinances of the City is hereby amended to substitute "International Existing Building Code, 2009 Edition" for "Standard Existing Building Code, 1988 Edition" at all place in which the latter appears therein; and any section references contained in Section 150.016 of said Code of Ordinances are amended to correspond with the sections of the former.

Fourth, Section 150.035 of the Code of Ordinances of the City is hereby amended to substitute "International Property Maintenance Code, 2009 Edition" for the "International Property Maintenance Code, 2003 Edition" at all place in which the latter appears therein; and any section reference in Section 150.036, 150.037 and 150.038 of said Code of Ordinances are amended to correspond with the sections of the former.

Fifth, Section 150.045 of the Code of Ordinances of the City is hereby amended to substitute "International Plumbing Code, 2009 Edition" for "International Plumbing Code, 2003 Edition" at all place in which the latter appears therein; and any section reference in Sections 150.046 and 150.047 of said Code of Ordinances are amended to correspond with the sections of the former.

Sixth, Section 150.055 of the Code of Ordinances of the City is hereby amended to substitute "International Fuel Gas Code, 2009 Edition" for "International Gas Code, 2003 Edition" at all place in which the latter appears therein; and any section reference in Section 150.056 of said Code of Ordinances are amended to correspond with the sections of the former.

Seventh, Section 150.065 of the Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to substitute "International Mechanical Code, 2009 Edition" for "Standard Mechanical Code, 1997 Edition" at all place in which the latter appears therein; and any section references in Section 150.066 of said Code of Ordinances are amended to correspond with the sections of the former.

Eighth, Section 150.100 of the Code of Ordinances of the City is hereby amended to substitute "International Energy Conservation Code, 2009 Edition" for "International Energy Conservation Code, 2003 Edition" at all places in which the latter appears therein; and any section references in Sections 150.101 or 150.102 of said Code of Ordinances are amended to correspond with the sections of the former.

Ninth, Section 151.01 of the Code of Ordinances of the City is hereby amended to substitute "International Electrical Code, 2008 Edition" for "International Electrical Code, 2003 Edition" at all places in which the latter appears therein; and any section references in Sections 151.02 and 151.03 of said Code of Ordinances are amended to correspond with the sections of the former.

Tenth, any person violating the Code of Ordinances of the City, as amended by this ordinance, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction therefor assessed a fine as prescribed in Section 10.99 of said Code; and each day such violation continues and each part of any day any such violation occurs shall constitute a separate offense.

Eleventh, nothing contained in this ordinance shall cause any rights heretofore vested to be altered, affected or impaired in any way and all such rights may be hereafter enforced as if this ordinance had not been adopted.

Twelfth, this ordinance is cumulative of and in addition to all other ordinances of the City on the same subject and all such ordinances are hereby expressly saved from repeal. Provided however, where the provisions of any International Code adopted or amended by this Ordinance conflict with the Standard Unsafe Building Abatement Code, 1985, adopted by Section 150.025 of the Code of Ordinances of the City, or the local amendments thereto contained in Section 150.026 of said Code of Ordinances, the provisions of said Standard Unsafe Building Abatement Code and said amendments thereto shall prevail; where to provisions of any International Code adopted or amended by this ordinance conflicts with the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance of the City and any amendments thereto, the provisions of the Zoning Ordinance or amendments thereto shall prevail; but where the provisions of any International Code adopted or amended by this ordinance and any other ordinance of the City conflict or overlap, whichever imposes the more stringent regulations or penalties, as the case may be, shall prevail.

Thirteenth, in the event any section or provision of this ordinance is found to be unconstitutional, void or inoperative by the final judgment of a court of competent jurisdiction, such defective provision, if any, is hereby declared to be severable from the remaining sections and provisions of this ordinance and such remaining sections and provisions shall remain in full force and effect.

Fourteenth, this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its descriptive caption has been published twice in the Brazosport Facts.


