In compliance with the regulations established in TPDES General Permit No. TXR040000, the Brazoria County Stormwater Quality Coalition has developed a Stormwater Management Program (SWMP) as required by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality. The Coalition's stormwater management program contains best management practices to ensure that municipal operations and residential activities within the community will not negatively impact the stormwater discharges into our local water bodies. In addition, the Coalition has developed a designated stormwater website (www.TXMS4.com/Brazoria) that contains public education materials regarding stormwater quality issues, a copy of the SWMP, and copies of the annual reports that are submitted to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality each year.
