Freeport Debris Removal Schedule 9/24/2021

Curbside debris removal will commence on Monday 9/27/2021. A huge thank you to Freeport residents, for all the hard work and effort in getting debris from Hurricane Nicholas to the curb. Ashbritt Inc., the city's emergency debris hauler is mobilizing 3 trucks and crews to service the City, and will be arriving late Saturday night from Missouri. They will be working daily starting Monday from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. until all the debris is picked up.

They will work very quickly, so please bring any remaining debris to the curb as soon as possible. The last day to bring material to the curb for pick up is Tuesday October 5th. Please separate green vegetative debris from Construction materials and household waste. The green vegetative debris is being picked up and hauled to a designated location for burning. The construction and household debris will be taken to the landfill.

The cost of debris pick-up as a result of Hurricane Nicholas will NOT be charged to individual property owners. However, any <u>debris deposited at the curb after October 5th may be assessed</u> under the city's regular garbage rates to be paid by the customer.

Freeport property owners are still encouraged to self-report all damage assessments due to Hurricane Nicholas using the link and QR Code provided on the City Website. As of this afternoon, 211 property owners had filed reports on the Crisis Tracking System, including 103 residences being "affected", 23 reporting minor damage, 4 with major damage, and 1 considered destroyed. Eighty business have also reported. Residents who have not reported and have questions may contact city hall during regular business hours 979-233-3526
