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AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF FREEPORT, TEXAS, CONTAINING A PREAMBLE; AMENDING DIVISION (B) OF SECTION 97.04 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF SAID CITY TO ADD THERETO A NEW ITEM, TO BE KNOWN AS ITEM (7), PROVIDING THAT THE NAME OF THE STREET SHOWN ON THE PLAT OF THE FREEPORT TOWNSITE AS CHERRY STREET SHALL HEREAFTER BE KNOWN AS MARTIN LUTHER KING BOULEVARD; CONTAINING SAVINGS CLAUSES; CONTAINING A SEVERANCE CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING THAT THIS ORDINANCE SHALL TAKE EFFECT AND BE IN FORCE FROM AND AFTER ITS PASSAGE AND ADOPTION.

WHEREAS, the City of Freeport, Texas, ("the City") is a "Home Rule City" and a "Home Rule Municipality" lying and situated in Brazoria County, Texas, as described in and defined by Section 5, Article XI of the Constitution of Texas and Section 1.005 of the Local Government Code of Texas, respectively; and,

WHEREAS, Sections 51.072, 54.004 of the Local Government Code, Section 311.001, Subsection (a) of the Transportation Code and Sections 2.01, 2.02 and Items (p) and (u) of Section 3.07 of the Home Rule Charter of the City authorize the City Council thereof to adopt the provisions of this Ordinance; and,

First, Division (B) of Section 97.04 of the Code of Ordinances of the City is hereby amended to add thereto a new Item (7) which shall read as follows:

"(7) The name of Cherry Street, as shown on the Plat of the Freeport Townsite on file in Volume 2, page 95 of the Plat Records of Brazoria County, Texas, is hereby changed to Martin Luther King Boulevard."

Second, nothing contained in this ordinance shall cause any rights heretofore vested to be altered, affected or impaired in any way and all such rights may be hereafter enforced as if this ordinance had not been adopted.

Third, this ordinance is cumulative of and in addition to all other ordinances of the City on the same subject and all such ordinances are hereby expressly saved from repeal. Provided however, where this ordinance and another ordinance conflict or overlap, this ordinance shall prevail.
