

This Agreement, by and between the CITY OF FREEPORT, TEXAS, a municipal corporation lying and situated in Brazoria County, Texas, hereinafter "the City", and the other undersigned, hereinafter called "the Demolisher" (whether one or more), viz.:

WITNESSETH:

- 1. All work will be completed in a good and workmanlike manner and according to the terms hereof and the specifications and bid document signed by or on behalf of the Demolisher and attached hereto.
- 2. All materials, appliances, fixtures, equipment, supplies, machinery, tools, supervision of work, labor, insurance, services and any other commodity, item or expense necessary to complete the demolition and removal of such structures and the cleaning of the premises shall be furnished at Demolisher's expense and Demolisher shall for all purposes be regarded as an independent contractor.
- 3. Demolisher agrees to indemnify the City and the officers, agents and employees of the City from any and all claims for personal injury or property damage made by or for any compensation for labor or materials furnished by any third party, including but not being limited to the claims of any officer, partner, agent or employee of Demolisher, arising out of or resulting from the demolition of such structures, the removal of such structures from the premises and the cleaning of all debris from the premises and from all interest, costs of court, attorney's fees and other expenses incurred by the City or any officer, agent or employee of the City in connection therewith.

- 1. The bidder will execute the attached contracts, herein-after "the contracts", (all the terms and conditions of which form a part of these specifications and are incorporated herein by reference) within ten (10) days after the bid is awarded to the bidder.
- 2. The bidder will begin the demolition and removal of the structures to be demolished and the abatement and removal of all asbestos from such structures within ten (10) days after the date that the City approves the contracts.
- 3. The bidder will complete the demolition and removal of all structures and the abatement and removal of all asbestos from such structures within three (3) days, weather permitting. The demolition and removal of all structures and the abatement and removal of all asbestos from such structures by the bidder must be completed before payment will me made.

This inter local agreement is with Brazoria County to address community hazard from natural or man made disasters. The proposals have been reviewed locally and submitted to the Brazoria County Flood Plain Coordinator and Houston and Galveston Area Council. This program is a cost share of 25/75 percentage of the project. The City of Freeport is able to make application for eligible programs during a Presidential declared disaster within the State of Texas.

In order to participate, the City of Freeport must provide a payment of \$346.15 for its portion of cost share among twenty six participants within Brazoria County. The last funding period, the City of Freeport received a HMP funding for Hurricane Shutter at the Police and Fire Station.

1.6 This agreement covers the following project:

Brazoria County and Houston-Galveston Area Council ("H-GAC") have entered into an Intergovernmental Agreement for the completion of a Hazard Mitigation Plan that includes an analysis of hazards that could potentially impact the County and a list of potential projects to mitigate the hazards. See Exhibit's "A" and "B".

The County is obligated to H-GAC to complete and return all forms requested by H-GAC and H-GAC's consultants. The County and City will work together to provide HGAC with all requested information necessary to develop the Hazard Mitigation Plan.

1.7 The initial term of this Agreement shall be for a period of nine (9) months, commencing on the 1st day of January, 2011, and terminating on the 30th day of September, 2011.

II.

- 2.1 The Parties agree to provide the following services, either directly or by contracting and the following levels of funding subject to the conditions and exceptions described hereinabove.
 - 2.2 City Responsibilities:
 - a. City shall coordinate with the Brazoria County Floodplain Administrator to provide project work sheets which are necessary to prepare a Regional Hazard Mitigation Plan.
 - b. City shall pay to County its proportionate share of the \$9,000.00 County will pay to HGAC. (i.e. 26 participants then, 1/26th of \$9,000.00 is \$346.15).
 - c. City may pay its proportionate share in two payments on or before March 30, 2011 and August 31, 2011.
 - d. City shall adopt a resolution which adopts the final Regional Hazard Mitigation Plan.
 - 2.3 County Responsibilities:
 - a. County will pay H-GAC \$9,000.00 for the preparation of the Regional Hazard Mitigation Plan.
 - b. County will coordinate and assist City in obtaining all information necessary to be provided to H-GAC, which will include project work sheets, contact information, documents pertaining to mitigation strategies, and final adoption resolution.
 - c. County will facilitate community meetings.

- 3.1 City and County recognize and agree that nothing herein shall be construed to create any rights in third parties.
- 3.2 The Parties expressly agree that no party shall have the right to seek indemnification or contribution from any other party hereto for any losses, costs, expenses, or damages directly or indirectly arising, in whole or part from this Agreement.
- 3.3 Whenever possible, each provision of this Agreement shall be interpreted in such a manner as to be effective and valid under applicable law, but if any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase, work or portion of this Agreement is, for any reason, held invalid unconstitutional or otherwise unenforceable by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct, and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions thereof.
- 3.4 The Rights and obligations of this Agreement shall not be assigned without prior written consent of City and County.
- 3.5 This Agreement and all obligations created hereunder shall be performable in Brazoria County, Texas.
- 3.6 This Agreement shall be construed and enforced in accordance with and governed by the laws of the State of Texas.
- 3.7 This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties and their administrators, agents, employees, successors and assigns permitted by this Agreement.
