In March I sent a survey to employees requesting input on their thoughts about their work, management, and other areas of the City. It is important to me to "focus on employees". I believe that we must work to engage employees to input into offering suggestions on ways to improve our city efforts. I have been writing letters from the City Manager's office to try to keep employees informed as well as attending departmental meetings to talk with all employees. I also plan to share the information attached with employees. A total of 74 of 136 employees (54%) participated in the survey, which was somewhat disappointing, but I will continue to work to gain their trust in this process. I believe the only true way to provide significant improvements in efficiency is to push responsibility to lower level employees to provide ideas on how to do their jobs better and more efficiently. This survey is one of a number of efforts to achieve this goal. I will discuss my opinion of the survey with you at council.
