Application Withdrawal – Any request for withdrawal of an application must be submitted in writing to the Building Secretary. Once a request for a conditional use permit has been advertised and notification of the public hearing mailed, such request must be placed on a public hearing agenda whereby the appropriate body will consider and act on the request for withdrawal of the application at that time. The Planning and Zoning Commission is under no obligation to grant a request for withdrawal of the application, and may still act on the request as originally submitted. It should be understood that there will be no refunds.

Note 2:

Application Presentation – At the applicable Planning and Zoning Commission public hearing, an applicant shall have Fifteen (15) minutes to make a formal presentation of the project proposal. Due to the size and arrangement of the City Council Chambers, tripod-mounted opaque renderings generally prove to be an effective means of presentation. the use of slides is another means of visual aid for project presentations. the applicant shall assume full responsibility for providing a properly prepared and compatible slide carousel to staff prior to the public hearing. The use of transparencies on an overhead projector is another effective means of material presentation. If additional equipment is needed, it shall be the applicant's responsibility to provide or make the necessary arrangements.

Note 3:

Additional Information Submitted – Only the information which has been presented by the applicant at the Planning and Zoning Commission public hearing will be presented to the City Council at an appeal. Any additional information presented to the City Council which has not been previously submitted to and reviewed by the Planning and Zoning Commission will be referred by the City Council back to the Planning and Zoning Commission which may cause delays in action by the City Council.



A copy of the memorandum of agreement used to initiate service with PoliceReports.US will be emailed to you in MS-Word format for your review.

Here are some ideas to consider to help your agency promote online report distribution.

By letting citizens and businesses know they can get police reports <u>online</u> instead of <u>inline</u> you should be able to reduce the walk-in and mail-in requests for the type of reports made available online by <u>60%~80%</u> within a <u>90 day period</u>.

Recommended Actions by the Agency/City:

- Update your agency website to clearly articulate which document types can be purchased online
- Place a prominent link on your home page and FAQ list for citizens looking for information on obtaining a police report
- If the city's website has an "e-Services" page include the police reports link
- Update any pre-recorded information message on how to obtain a report with the online option
- Post notices in your records department lobby specifying the document types that can be purchased online
- If you have a downloadable document request form on your website, update it to specify which
 document types are available online and don't require a formal "Freedom of Information" request.
- Have your traffic officers notify the parties involved in traffic accidents that collision reports are available online
- For citizens and businesses requesting reports by mail or at the records counter include a notice that reports are available online with the returned report
- Many agencies issue press releases and contact local newspapers requesting articles be written
 alerting the public that police reports can be accessed online(Examples:
 http://www.policereports.us/pressreleases.html)
- Have the city include an article/notice in the city newsletter and/or utility bill
- If you currently have a debit account service for businesses notify them that the online service is now the preferred method of report distribution

PoliceReports.US Marketing Activity:

- All PoliceReports.US business account holders will be notified that police reports will be available online from your agency
- Contact your agencies frequent document requesters and offer them a PoliceReports.US business account for faster access to reports
- Notify the major insurance and document retrieval companies in your region
- Add your agencies eCommerce link to the PoliceReports.US website
